A growing number of private sector members are working with the Economic Alliance Houston Port Region, a non-profit organization that represents the economic development interests of Houston Ship Channel communities and its specific business sectors.

- Mayors, city councils, and county and port commissioners representing 16 Houston Ship Channel communities have identified economic development as a top priority. Harris County, the Port of Houston Authority, eleven municipalities, nine chambers of commerce, and foundations representing unincorporated communities fund the Economic Alliance.
- The Economic Alliance's "one-stop" concept means members now can work with other local and regional organizations as part of a coordinated, collaborative network necessary for large scale regional impact.

The Economic Alliance scope of economic development services include:

- Facilitating business specific tax incentive programs (such as tax abatements)
- Supporting the creation and expansion of local Foreign Trade Zones
- Facilitating property specific tax incentive programs (historic site tax exemptions)
- Conducting seminars, lectures, meetings, and public hearings
- Conducting seminars for local economic and community development professionals
- Providing workforce analysis
- Compiling economic and business related data
- Stimulating, encouraging, marketing, and developing business location and commercial activity in the community
- Interacting and supporting local and state officials' local economic development organizations, and chambers of commerce
- Promoting/advertising the region's communities and conducting solicitation programs to attract business, visitors, and conventions
- Disseminating economic and business related data
- Interacting with the Texas Economic Development Council of Texas on behalf of the region
